














Learning About Plants

The grade 3 students performed various science experiments and activities to explore the different parts of a plant and its function. They had nature walks around the school to get samples of roots and leaves for their worksheet. They studied two root systems, taproot and fibrous roots. They sorted leaves based on their physical appearance. The students also investigated how water moves through the stem and leaves of a celery. They also looked into the basic parts of a flower and its purpose. The students curiously examined a white oriental lily in their Flower Dissection activity.

Take a look at all the amazing creativity and design concepts put into these art projects.


Amazing job grade 4's!

Halloween is around the corner. Watch out for these spooky cobwebs and the creative spiders that spun them!











Grade 5 Fall Highlights



Fatty Legs by Margaret Pokiak



The school recently invested in a new literacy program called Guided Reading by Fountas and Pinnell. Over 1,200 books arrived in October and we couldn't be more excited about it! On October 25 staff met with a reading clinician from River East Transcona School Division and were trained on how to use the new program. Guided reading is a practice that involves a teacher working with small groups of students who demonstrate similar reading behaviors and can read similar levels of texts. The goal of guided reading is to teach students' reading strategies and ultimately become independent readers.
