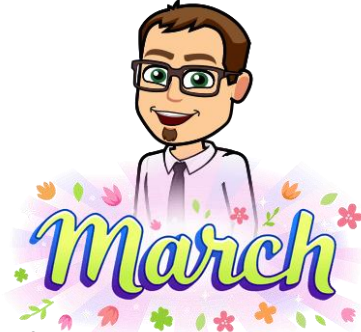

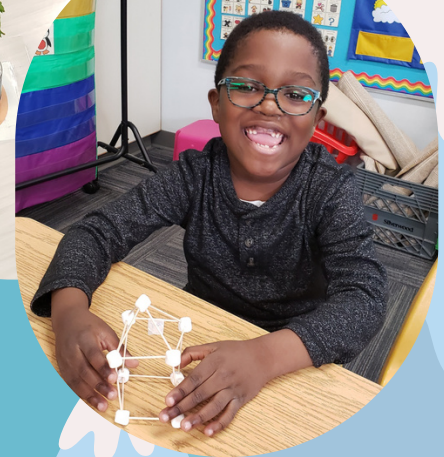
The Season of Advent

Pre-K and Kindergarten celebrated this day of love and kindness together. They had snacks and made a cute flower craft.

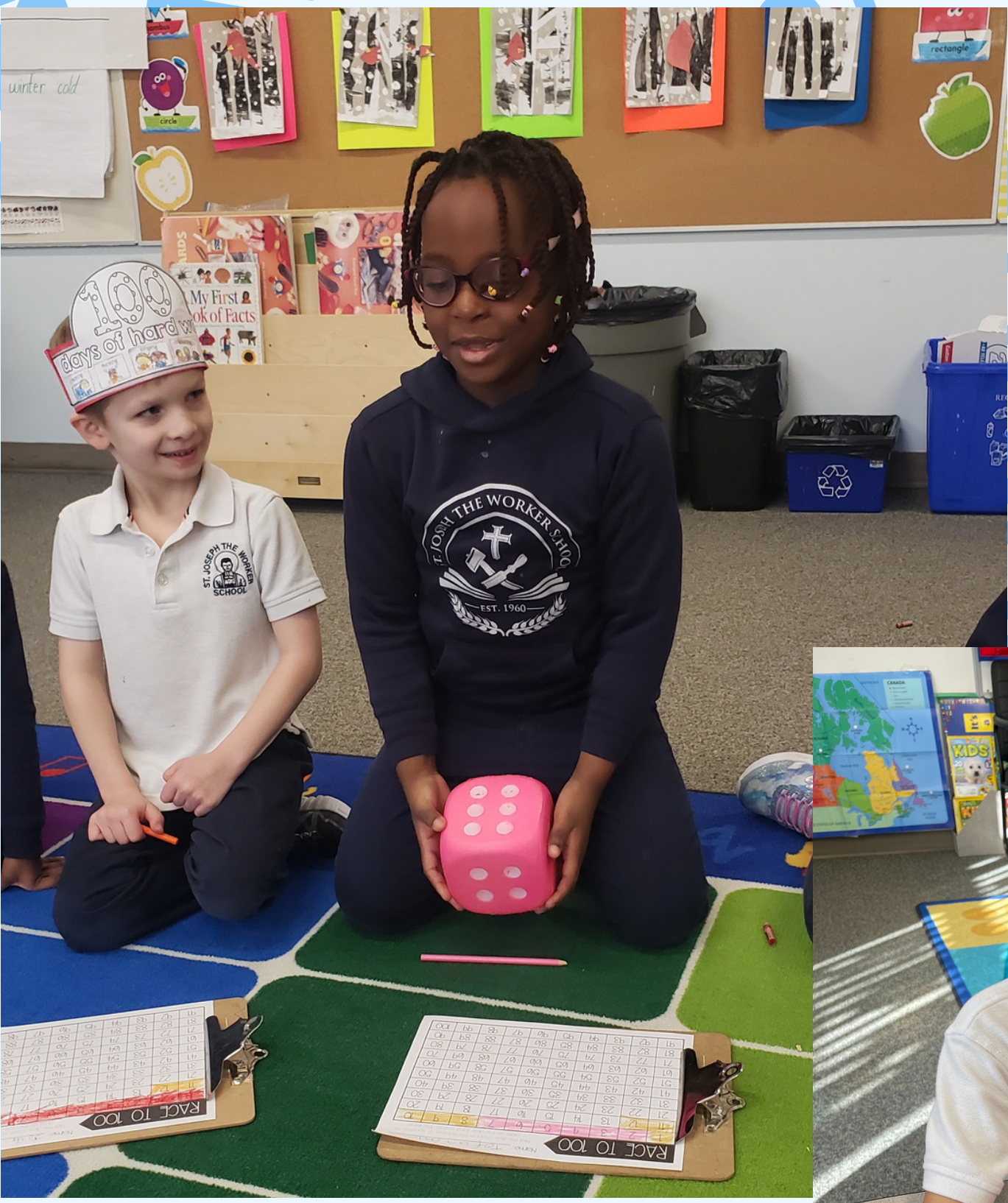


Catholic Schools Week

Love is definitely in the air last Valentine's Day when the students generously shared letters, treats and compliments with each other.



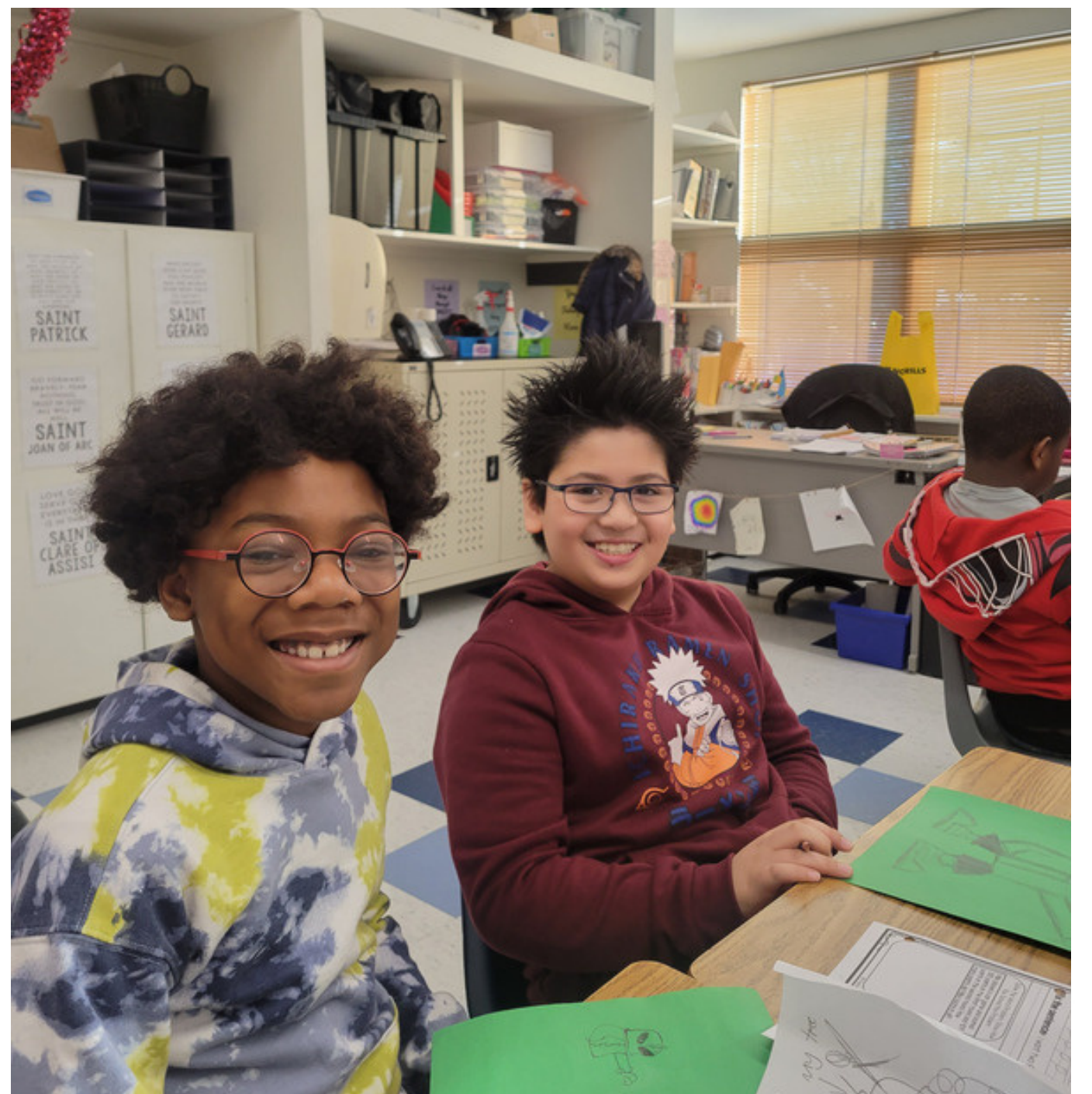
Lunar New Year

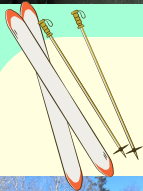
PAPER LANTERNS AND STAINED GLASS HEARTS

Since I last wrote, we have had the choir sing at the Remembrance Day service, and our Christmas Concert.

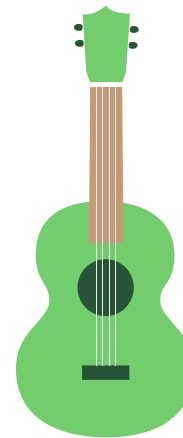
I am so proud of all of our students for their, patience and perseverance in preparing for the concert. It certainly paid off! I received many kudos to share with the students.

November and December were filled with preparations for the Christmas Concert, lots of singing, choreography and acting. January brought a field trip to the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra for our grade 2 and 3 classes, where they saw and heard some pretty amazing music.

This term, all classes have been focusing on developing their musical literacy. The primary goal is to be an independent reader and musician, so if they choose to enter a band or guitar programme in middle school, they can with the confidence that they can read music and play in an ensemble. Another goal is for students to write their own compositions. They will begin to understand how to write music in a group, how much work goes into a composition, and how short these compositions actually are when you play them. Hopefully this will help them understand that music is an art form, and it takes a lot of work and determination to create something you are proud of and that people like!

Grade 4 students were the first group this year to study the Ukelele.

Not only can they strum chords to accompaniment tracks, but they are learning to read the music on the staff and apply it to the instrument. They are learning how the fretboard works and that one pitch can be played in a variety of places on the instrument.

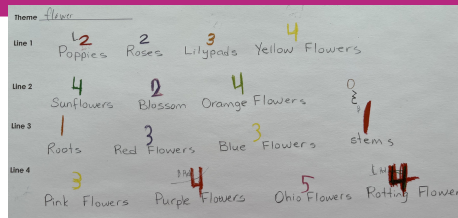

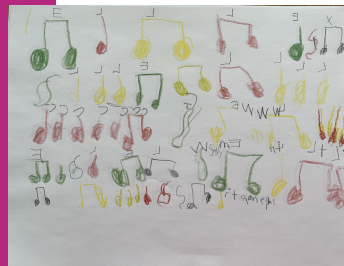
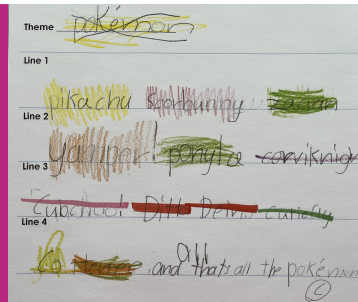
Boomwhacker Compositions

... in K, Gr 1, 2 and 3



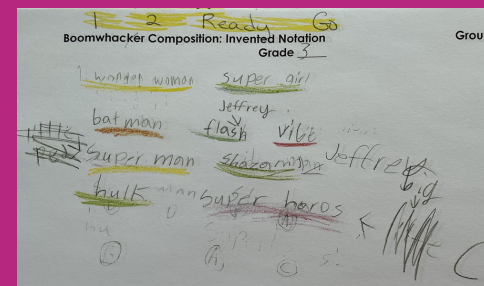
PreK and K

K students created their compositions on two words: Snowman, and Hat, and two notes - Mi and So. They put 8 pictures in their own order and away they went. Pre K students composed in a whole group setting, on bells and sticks, and made choices with Mrs Jackson.



Boomwhacker Compositions are great for teamwork.

The focus of each grade was to use invented notation and work and play together. Grades 2 and 3 had more specific criteria. Their goal was to come up with theme that has a lot of rhythmic words. To put the words in 4, 4 beat lines, to end on the C and play it together. Writing down the music was intended to be an experiment using invented notation. 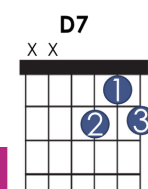
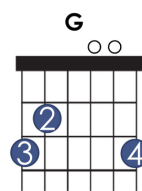

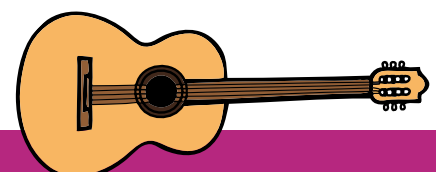
The grade 6's can play the melodies of songs like Ode to Joy and Rockin Robin using the first 3 strings, and songs using chords!
